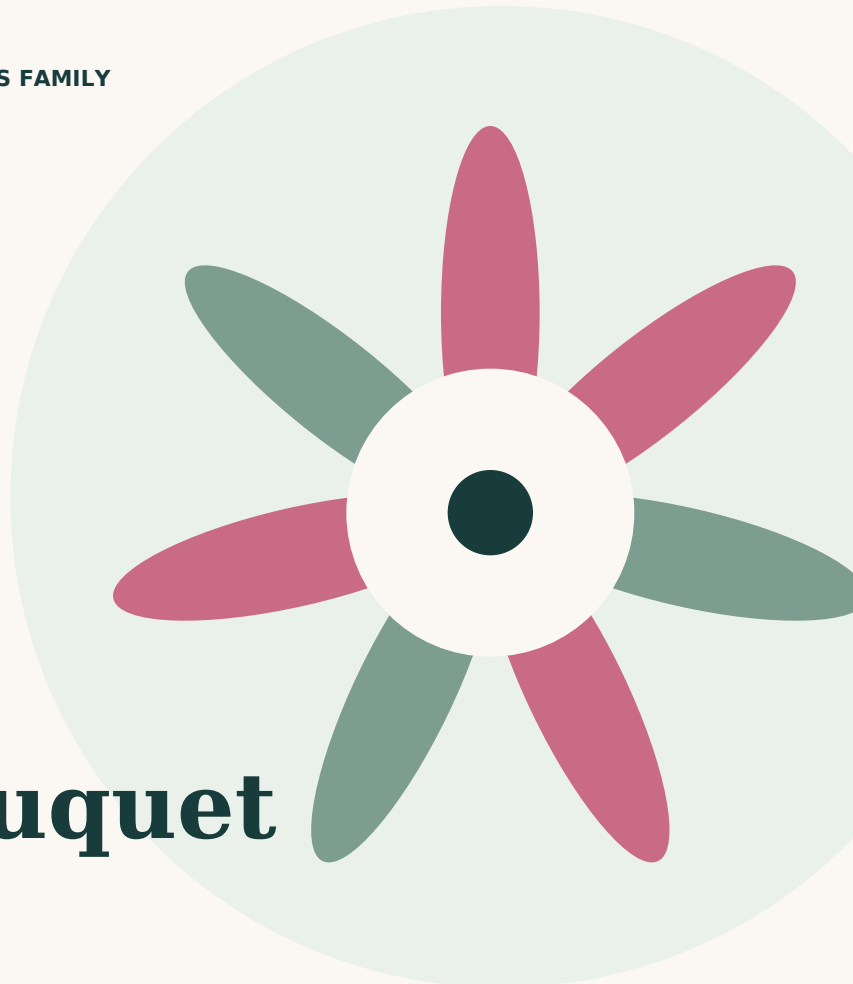




Heartfelt Bouquet Blanket

Written crochet notes · original charts · flower and leaf instructions

How to use this guide

The first three body rounds and the flower/leaf methods are written out. For the exact stitch placements in body Rounds 4–38, keep the main chart beside you; the source video also follows the chart for those rounds.

US CROCHET TERMS

Approximately 91 cm / 36 in across · 3.5 mm hook · 39 body rounds · 11 flowers and 11 leaves

Before you begin

Source and scope. This guide explains the charted construction in English. The 39-round body is a chart-led design, and no independent written stitch count has been verified for every round. Read every symbol in the seven repeated sections before starting a new round.

Project details

Finished size	About 91 cm / 36 in in the sample; your yarn and tension can change this.
Hook & tools	3.5 mm crochet hook, suitable yarn, yarn needle, scissors and stitch markers.
Yarn	The source project uses Dawn Impression yarn for body/flowers and a 4-ply cotton/acrylic yarn for leaves. Choose coordinated shades and check the source for its yarn details.
Make	One charted body; 11 rolled flowers; 11 leaves.

US stitch key

ch / sp / st	chain / space / stitch
sl st / sc / hdc	slip stitch / single crochet / half double crochet
dc / tr	double crochet / treble crochet
dc2tog / dc3tog	work 2 / 3 unfinished double crochets together as one decrease
rnd / rep	round / repeat

Chart reading: begin at the center and follow the numbered rounds outward. The sample is arranged in **seven repeated sections**. Pink and black symbols distinguish chart lines; use the source's yarn directions for actual color changes. An oval means a chain, an × means a single crochet, and a filled oval/dot in the flower chart is a slip stitch.

Blanket body

Work in joined rounds from the center outward; repeat each chart section seven times.

Foundation and early rounds shown in the video

Center ring. Ch 4; join the first chain with a sl st to form a ring.

Round 1. Ch 3 (counts as the first dc). Work [ch 2, dc into ring] six times; ch 2 and join to the top of the beginning ch-3. You have **7 dc and 7 ch-2 spaces**.

Round 2. Ch 3 (first dc), dc in the same dc. Ch 3. Work [2 dc in the next dc, ch 3] around the remaining six dc; join to the top of the beginning ch-3. You have **7 groups of 2 dc** separated by ch-3 spaces.

Round 3. In each two-dc group of Round 2, put **2 dc in each dc**, with the charted ch-3 separation between groups. Use a beginning ch-3 for the first dc and join at its top. You have **7 groups of 4 dc**.

Continue with the chart

Rounds 4-8	Grow the seven repeating fan sections exactly as charted. Check each chain space and increase before repeating the section.
Round 9	The video demonstrates dc2tog. At the start, ch 2 supplies the first unfinished dc; complete the decrease as shown. Place each later decrease where the chart shows it.
Rounds 10-12	Follow the numbered chart lines for their solid stitches, spaces and decreases; keep the seven sections aligned.
Round 13	The video introduces dc3tog. At the start, ch 2 acts as the first unfinished dc; work the other two partial dc and draw through all remaining loops.
Rounds 14-38	Continue reading the chart one round at a time; the shaping and fan widths vary. Check the seven repeats at the end of each round.
Round 39	Finish with the charted sc edging, placing 2 sc into a stitch wherever the chart marks an increase. Join, fasten off and weave in the tail.

Check each round: mark the first stitch, follow one complete chart section, then make the same section six more times. Count a joining slip stitch only as a join, and inspect the seven section boundaries before starting the next round.

Roses, leaves & assembly

These instructions summarize the source video and the separate accessory diagrams.

Rolled flower • make 11

Foundation / Row 1. Leave a short beginning tail. Make **52 foundation chains** and one turning chain. Starting in the second chain from the hook, work sc across, using the back loop of each foundation chain. Ch 3 and turn for Row 2.

Row 2. The ch-3 is the first dc: ch 2, then dc in the same first sc to form a V. Repeatedly skip 2 sc and work (dc, ch 2, dc) into the next sc. Follow the flower chart for the full strip. Ch 3 and turn.

Row 3. In the first V's ch-2 space, work dc, ch 2, 2 dc (the beginning ch-3 counts as its first dc). Work (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in each remaining V space. Ch 1 and turn.

Row 4. In each shell's ch-2 space, work **8 dc** to form a petal. Make a sl st between neighboring shells. Fasten off with a long sewing tail. Starting at the end with the short tail, roll the strip with the right side of Row 4 facing outward; stagger the petals and sew firmly through the base.

Oval leaf • make 11

Ch **14**, then ch 1 to turn, leaving a sewing tail. Starting in the second chain from the hook, work along the first side: **sc, hdc, 2 dc, 6 tr, 2 dc, hdc, sc**. At the tip, ch 2 and work another sc into that same end chain. Work back along the opposite side of the foundation chain with hdc, 2 dc, 6 tr, 2 dc, hdc, sc. Join loosely with sl st to the first sc; fasten off with a second sewing tail. Check the leaf diagram when turning the tip.

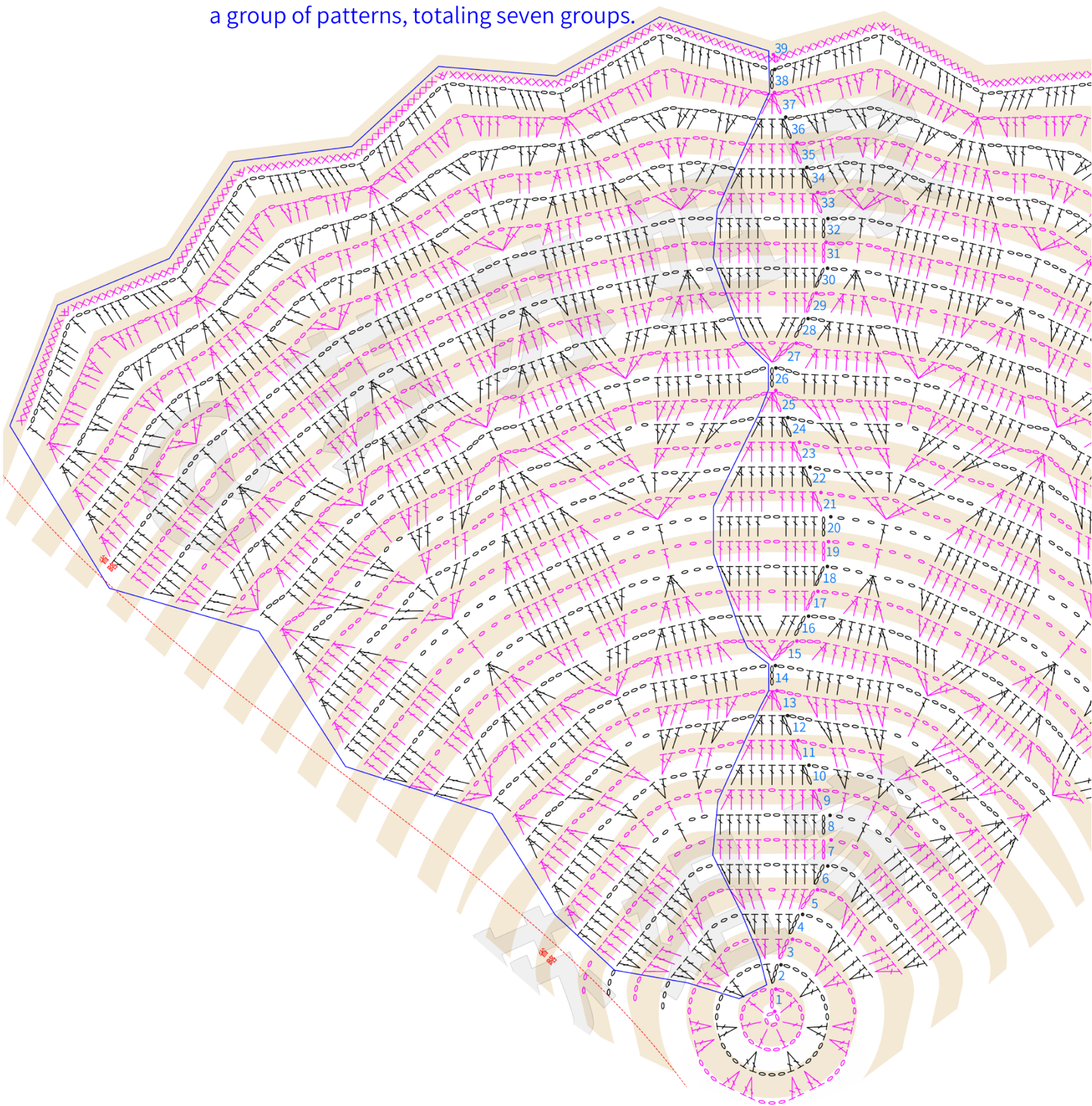
Attach and finish

Spread the blanket flat. Space **11 flowers** evenly along its outer edge; sew each base through the blanket. Position one of the **11 leaves** between each pair of flowers, secure at its ends, and weave all tails into the wrong side. Block gently to suit the yarn fiber.

Before sewing: pin or mark all 11 flower positions, then check that a leaf fits between successive flowers. Sew through the flower's base rather than its outer petals so the raised shape stays open.

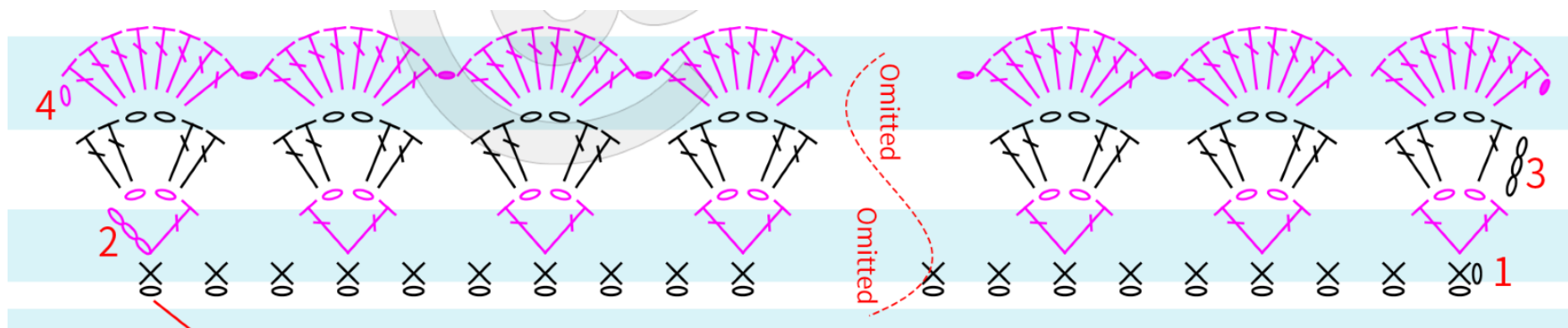
Main body chart • Rounds 1-39

Full source diagram. Follow one seven-section repeat from the center to the edge.



Flower chart · make 11

The chart suppresses some repeated motifs in the middle; continue the same sequence across the strip.



Foundation chain 52 sts

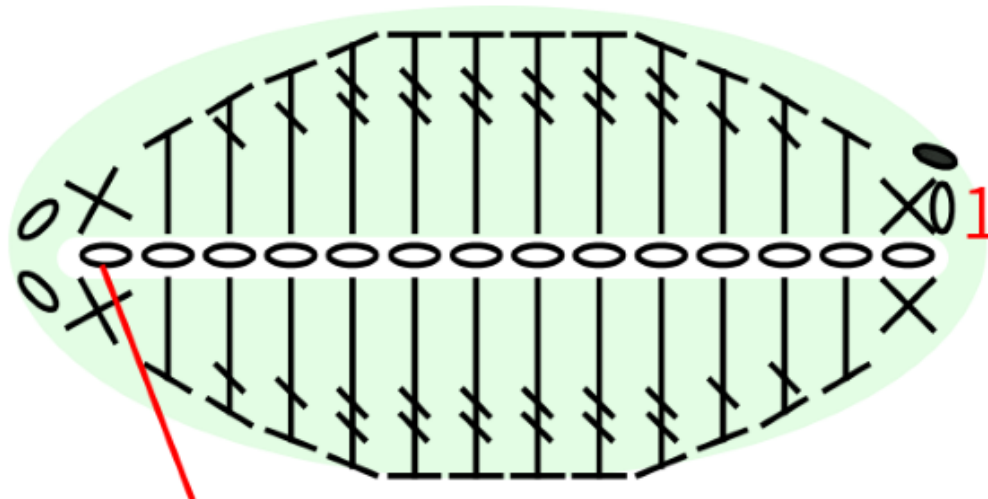
(Leave a 10cm tail before casting on / Leave a 50cm tail at the end.)

Read bottom to top: 52 foundation chains plus the turning chain → a row of sc → spaced V units → (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) shells → 8-dc petals separated by slip stitches. The red dashed break means the chart omits repeats in its illustration; it does not mean skip part of the actual flower.

The chart notes approximately 10 cm of tail before the strip and a long sewing tail at the end. Adjust the sewing tail to your preferred method.

Leaf chart • make 11

Work around both sides of the foundation chain to create one pointed oval.



Foundation chain 14 sts
(Leave a 15cm tail before casting on and at the end.)

Stitch-height sequence: sc → hdc → 2 dc → 6 tr → 2 dc → hdc → sc; make the ch-2 point, then work back along the other side. The source diagram labels the foundation as 14 chains and suggests leaving approximately 15 cm of yarn tail for attaching each leaf.

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
